
You will recall our recent discussions concerning setting up a sub-committee on trout streams under the Southeastern Section's Forest-Game Committee. I have asked Tad Lane to serve as Chairman of this sub-committee and would like for you to be a member. The assignments are as follows:

1. Determine the status of trout streams as a natural resource in the Southern Appalachians.
2. Explore means of improving stream quality.
3. Suggest criteria for judging stream quality.
4. Examine the value of impoundments on trout streams.
5. Project the future potential of Southern Appalachian mountain streams in the overall recreational complex.

I have discussed this with Tad and he would like for members of the Committee to meet during the latter part of August or the first part of September. I hope the Committee can find time to visit areas in the Southern Appalachians which are examples of both natural and disturbed conditions. We would like to have a report for presentation at the Southeastern Meeting in October if possible.

If you feel that you are able to serve on this sub-committee, I would like for you to be thinking about areas which could be profitably visited in Tennessee. Tad will notify you soon to determine a time and place for the Committee meeting and request aid in setting up an itinerary.
